Notes:

- 2020 grant total five-year commitment is **\$3,284,263**.
 - Dana Naone Hall is a political activist dedicated to protecting Maui Native Hawaiian sacred places, burial sites, culture, and environmental values.
 - Chair will be filled every 3-5 years by a qualified U of HI professor to conduct projects promoting Native Hawaiian environmental science and literature.
 - 2021 grant to fulfill installment #2 and to pre-pay \$300,000 toward installment #5
- 2022: \$3,284,263 commitment - \$2,250,000 paid to date = \$1,034,263 outstanding.**
- 2023: Scheduled remaining payments are \$450,000 in 2023 and balance of \$134,263 in 2024.**
