#### **About Navian Hawaii**

Navian Hawaii is a 501c3 nonprofit organization providing quality end-of-life care to patients and their families throughout Oahu for over 40 years. Our mission is to Bring Hope, Reduce Fears and Impact Lives, and in 2011 we launched our Pediatric Hospice program – *Manaolana Keiki* (Hope for the Children).

Although most people associate hospice with the elderly, there is a great need in our community for the support of children diagnosed with a life-limiting illness. We have helped many families through their end of life journey, which can last just a few days to a few years.

The goal of our pediatric hospice program is to make sure families have the support they need to care for their child as well as helping other members of the family navigate through this difficult time.

This often includes helping them create lasting memories together while trying not to spend all their energy on the illness itself. Together we focus on "comfort care" making the child's quality of life top priority.

Each family has unique needs, which our pediatric team is specially trained in fulfilling. Some of these needs include obtaining essential equipment, as well as symptom and pain management in the home by our pediatric nurses and physicians. We try to eliminate the need of taking the child back and forth to the hospital for treatments that can be managed at home.

Our interdisciplinary team offers guidance, education and support while collaborating closely with the child's primary care physician and care team to prioritize the child's comfort. The recent addition of our Certified Child Life Specialist, helps us address the social-emotional needs of the patient and their siblings as they guide them through their end of life journey. We are proud to be the only dedicated pediatric hospice program in the state, giving us the ability to provide equitable access to hospice care for children and their families across the island of 'Oahu.

## Addressing the Community's Need:

- Our goal is to help each pediatric family feel adequately prepared for the challenges of dealing with a terminally ill child and providing comfort and resources along the way.
- We provide pediatric patients and families an additional layer of support during their endof-life journey, all in the comfort of their homes. This includes home visits by nurses and the entire pediatric team to manage symptoms and minimize pain and suffering, while also allowing patients to receive necessary medical care and treatment from other providers, promoting optimal quality of life.
- Our hospice services allow the child to be at home surrounded by their loved ones and
  extended family where they feel the most comfortable. This is especially important to our
  local families as extended 'Ohana is such a vital part of their support system.
- To increase peace of mind for caregivers, our on-call, specialized pediatric care allows families to avoid unnecessary hospitalizations and trips to the emergency room, giving them back precious time they can spend doing things that are most important to their child.
- Families rely on us to provide social-emotional support for the entire family. This includes
  advocating for and respecting the patient's wishes, understanding and empathizing with
  caregivers' goals and engaging with siblings through therapeutic activities that aid with
  coping.

## **Funding Request**

As the only pediatric hospice program in Hawaii, The Laurence H. Dorcy Hawaiian Foundation grant money would help us to increase our reach and service capacity so that we can provide support to more families.

Many pediatric services are not covered by insurance so we rely heavily upon philanthropic support in order to sustain and grow the program. The resources requested below are often considered best-practice for pediatric hospice programs across the country, and as leaders in our community we strive to ensure equitable access for our families in Hawaii. We strongly believe they deserve the same high-quality care.

# **Demographic Information**

- We provide services to all pediatric patients with a life-limiting illness who qualify to enroll with hospice or supportive care. Ninety percent of our families are lowincome, local residents.
- Who: Infant to young adult patients and their families, including caregivers, siblings, and children of adult hospice patients.
- Where: Island of 'Oahu- patients are seen in their homes or preferred place of comfort, and in the hospital when needed
- Capacity: The program averages roughly 10 patients at a time. Our reach fluctuates throughout the year as new children are diagnosed and others pass away. As our program continues to grow with the help of philanthropic support,

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# **Primary Funding Sources**

Navian Hawaii is primarily funded through Medicare, Medicaid or Primary Insurance. Because Pediatric Hospice is so different than adult hospice, many times it is extremely difficult for a parent to commit solely to "comfort care." It is such an emotional decision, and who can ever expect them to choose to give up that fight!

Some insurance companies offer a program called concurrent care, where patients can continue to receive curative treatments while still receiving the much-needed wrap-around services of hospice. In the event that this benefit is not available to a child, financial aid or charity care then kicks in. Allowing the patient and family peace of mind.
