- No centralized cancer treatment on Maui, Molokai or Lanai.
- Patients need to travel throughout Maui or to other islands for diagnostic tests and procedures.
- No PET scan machine on Maui.
  - (I looked up cost of a PET scanner anywhere from \$250,000 to \$750,000)
- Navigation program assists patients find treatment resources and locations and schedule appointments.
- Nutrition services to provide health, maintain strength, and alleviate pain.
- All support service programs offered free to participants.

**2023**: Due to pandemic, many patients put off cancer screening and treatment resulting in an increase of stage 3 and 4 patients in need of intense support.

- Many patients are homeless and/or unemployed lacking food, health insurance, and a clean place to receive treatment.
- Partnering with Ka Hale A Ke Ola Homeless Resource Center to make 5 beds available for homeless cancer patients.
- 1083 patients served in 2022, majority are 60+ in age.
- Majority of funds are via fundraisers. State of Hawaii gives \$135,000 annually and Maui County \$65,000. American Cancer Society provides transportation/lodging grants of \$70,000.

#### Target Needs:

The Pacific Cancer Foundation (PCF) provides free access, knowledge, and support services to Maui County cancer patients and their caregivers. Do you know any family that has not been impacted by cancer? It takes a village to assist cancer patients and their families through the most difficult time of their lives. PCF has become an integral part of that village. Due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, many cancer patients sheltered and did not get the testing or treatment they needed. As a result, there has been a much higher incidence of stage 3 and stage 4 cancers. PCF is seeing record numbers of cancer patients needing assistance. Having cancer is emotional, confusing, and overwhelming. Insurance coverages are confusing. PCF works with all cancer patients to sort out their own specific circumstances using a program called "Oncology Lay Navigation" that connects the patient and caregivers with many types of

In Maui County, the Maui United Way's A.L.I.C.E Report, (Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed), states that 58% of our residents are only one paycheck away from houselessness. At PCF, we have a solid infrastructure in serving our patients and work extremely diligently to raise funding to cover these gaps. All the funding requested in this proposal will be used assisting patients that need access to all the aspects of immediate treatment and the expenses that accompany those treatments.

Do you know what is worse than having cancer? The answer is having cancer while one is houseless or food insecure. Many of our houseless patients once thrived in steady jobs. All lost those jobs when they became ill due to cancer which resulted in the loss of medical insurance,

loss of income, inability to buy food, and loss of housing. The spiral continued when they could not be treated for their cancer due to lack of transportation, clean bathroom and resting facilities, and the right kinds of food to eat to minimize the illness due to treatment. Houselessness can make a survivable cancer a death sentence.

#### **How PCF Addresses the Target Needs:**

The Pacific Cancer Foundation (PCF) provides free support services to cancer patients and their caregivers including Oncology Lay Navigation, Dietitian Services and Nutritional Supplement Support, Transportation and Lodging for both cancer patients and their caregivers, Support Groups (Cancer Patient Group, caregiver group, and Men's Talk Story), Wellness Classes (Qui Gong and Meditation), Food Pantry for food insecure families, Wig and Breast Prosthesis Fittings, Assistance for Access to Financial Subsidies, and ongoing Education.

## How the Organization is Meeting that Need:

There are many gaps in our health care and social services systems. PCF is committed to raising funds and awareness to closing many of them. Other services PCF provides are as follows:

- 1) Registered Dietician Services
- 2) Support Groups (patient, caregiver, Men's Talk Story)
- 3) Lay Navigation (navigation through the healthcare and social services systems)
- 4) Assistance with wigs and head coverings
- 5) Assistance with Breast Prothesis fittings
- 6) Free nutritional supplements
- 7) Food Pantry for food insecure families
- 8) Access to medical equipment working with Gammie Homecare
- 9) Transportation working with MEO, the Maui County Office on Aging, Na Hoaloha, Angel Wings, and the American Cancer Society
- 10) Lodging working with the American Cancer Society and Hope Lodge

A growing problem is the continual of 5-10 houseless patients that cannot find immediate housing and cannot be treated because they need a resting place and a clean bathroom to just be able to receive their treatments. Many of these patients also lose their EBT privileges and medical insurance because they have no homes to receive mail or email. PCF is working with Ka Hale A Ke Ola Homeless Resource Center to utilize an area on their property with two units not covered in their usual "1st to work programs". These units have a possible 5 beds, remodeled facilities with a clean bathroom, and a meal program. Cancer does not wait. It readily grows at an accelerated pace when not treated. These units would give PCF time to do the following:

- 1) Provide a place to live while treatment begins until PCF secures housing by working with Maui Economic Opportunity, Goodwill, and other agencies to attain permanent housing.
- 2) Allow treatment to begin immediately.

- 3) There is a meal plan for each patient so the patient can concentrate on eating and PCF will fill in with nutritional supplements to help maintain a healthy weight during a time the patient will have challenges with eating.
- 4) Allow time for assessment of the patient's likely outcome (e.g., should the patient be transferred to our partner Hospice Maui; is it likely they will go into remission? Etc.)
